MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING
HELD AT CITY HALL
NOVEMBER 17, 2021

Councilmember Tillotson gave the invocation.

Clerk Reeves led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The minutes of the regular meeting held on November 3, 2021 were discussed. Motion to accept the minutes as written for 11/3/2021 was made by Councilmember Ridenour. Councilmember Thomas seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Bills in the amount of \$13,521.12 and payroll in the amount of \$10,277.16 were reviewed for payment approval. Councilmember Tillotson moved that the bills be approved as reviewed. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Ridenour. Motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Barthlome turned the time to Fire Chief Curtis Peck to report on the Fire Department. He reported that he has been working on getting online with the Fire Rescue One training. In talking with them he found out that he can only register one city per account, he could invite other cities to the training, but it won't count toward certification for the other cities. He reported that Santa would be coming to the fire station on December 4, 2021 at 1:00 p.m.

Superintendent Crookston presented the following Caribou County permit for review:
#2380 – Curtis Hill – Airport Hangar

Zoning Chairperson David Pristupa reported on a meeting that the Planning and Zoning Commission attended with the Caribou County Planning and Zoning board about the impact area. He reported that there would be changes coming concerning septic systems in the county and whether nitrate reducing systems would be required. He stated that the County Planning and Zoning was still recommending that the city bring its impact area boundary in on the north of the city to Gibson Lane. The city attorney had recommended that it be left where it is due to possible future expansion. He found out later that the County Commissioners had passed the map with the boundary staying where it currently is on Rich Road. There are some changes to the ordinance that the County Planning and Zoning would like to make and those will be discussed at a future meeting.

Clerk Reeves presented the canvassed election vote count to the council as follows: For the office of Mayor, Jackie Barthlome received a total of 120 votes. For the office of City Council, Larry G. Allen received a total of 110 votes, Colleen Fluckiger received a total of 117 votes, and Robyn Thomas received a

total of 47 votes. Councilmember Ridenour moved to accept the canvassed vote count. Councilmember Thomas seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Councilmember Ridenour moved to write a letter of support for the Itafos Conda Husky 1/North Dry Ridge (H1/NDR) Mine Project. Councilmember Tillotson seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Superintendent Crookston reported that the garbage truck got a flat tire at the dump and the tire had to be replaced. He would like to replace 4 tires to upgrade the tires to a better tire. He got a bid of \$1254.00 from A-Plus Automotive for 3 tires since they had already replaced the damaged one. He also got a bid of \$1321.40 from Ron Keller tire for 4 new tires. Councilmember Ridenour moved to go with the bid from Ron Keller Tire and replace all 4 tires and use the new tire as a spare. Councilmember Thomas seconded the motion. Councilmember Tillotson also reported that she had received some complaints about the employees driving the garbage truck too fast. Superintendent Crookston stated that he would address that concern.

Mayor Barthlome reported that the city had applied for the Local Highways Technical Assistance (LHTAC) grant to update the transportation plan. If the city receives the grant which is for \$30,000.00 Keller and Associates will help the city with the update of the transportation plan.


